Today's readings celebrate Luke the evangelist

Isaiah 35.3-6
Psalm 147.1-7
2 Timothy 4.5-17
Luke 10.1-9

Luke wrote more of the new testament than any other writer contributing the gospel that bears his name and the book of Acts which maps the history of the early Christian church. Luke was a gentile and although he never met Jesus in person, his gospel tells us that he came to know Jesus by talking to eyewitnesses of Jesus' life, death, and Resurrection. He was a doctor and accompanied Paul on his missionary journeys.

For the church community at High Easter as they reflect on the past year and pray for God's blessing on the year ahead.

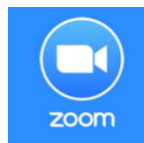
We pray for our Diocese, help them to guide and equip us to respond to the challenges of our times in new ways so that the churches in the Diocese can bring your love to all.
